SELECTION CRITERIA

Apprentices eligible for nomination will meet the following selection criteria:

- Have commenced/completed their trade course at an approved RTO;
- Be highly regarded by their employer for their knowledge, above average skill, application to work, co-operative attitude and responsibility to their company, its suppliers and clients;
- Have performed with diligence, proved courteous and co-operative with staff and achieved merit in their pursuit of excellence.
